

We began by supporting the PA State Society (PASSAR) in conjunction with their Quarterly meeting in Bucks County at a wreath-laying ceremony at Washington's Crossing State Park followed by a Memorial tribute to Past State President Joseph M. Shaffer the next morning.

On Saturday evening, 3 August, we presented the colors for the closing banquet of the 73rd annual Reunion of the US Army's 83rd Infantry Division which marched thru France and Germany in the closing days of WWII. There were 7 members of "the Greatest Generation" in attendance and we got great press coverage.

Next up were SGT Fred Fonseca, Bruce Hustis, and Steve Sims out at the Goschenhoppen Folk

Festival, five of us favoring the Daughters of the British Empire as Queen Elizabeth II's Chaplain presented the sermon at an Evensong service in Chestnut Hill, and four CG troops who made it to the 2nd annual King's Highway Day in the Frankford section of Philadelphia at the site of the oldest continuously-used road bridge in America (and Generals Washington & Rochambeau's army used it on their way from Newport, RI to York-town, VA at the end of the Revolutionary War).

On Sunday, 18 August, President Frank O'Donnell and several Past Presidents sponsored a Color Guard picnic at the home of CPT Anders in West Chester. There were 14 Guardsmen and 6 of their ladies in attendance AND we were able to welcome NEW Member Dennis Bostick into his uniform on that day as well. Although a bit warm, all seemed to enjoy themselves being together OUT of uniform for a change.

We finished the August actions at a grave re-dedication ceremony for John Pierre Burr, son of Aaron Burr, VP

to Thomas Jefferson from 1801-05, in Eden Cemetery, Collingdale, PA. Again, there was some good press coverage on this event

September means Constitution Day and we hosted the 50th annual DAR/SAR joint luncheon, again at the Hilton DoubleTree in King of Prussia, on 14 September, where we had an excellent meal with over 80 combined CAR/






In 2009, the Philadelphia Continental Chapter had a group of chapter compatriots match a \$25,000 donation by Robert McNeil, Jr. Arizona sculptor & compatriot, James Muir, was commissioned to create the "Sons of Liberty-1775". The 800-pound, 8-foot high bronze statue of the Minuteman holding a musket rests upon 19,000 pounds of quarried Kentucky limestone, material specifically requested by the artist James Muir, and is located in front of our SAR headquarters at 809 West Main Street in Louisville. Public Service and Heroism Awards

An SAR Heroism Commendation and Medal recognizes outstanding bravery and self-sacrifice in the face of imminent danger - i.e., acts which involve great personal courage and risk to the recipient. It is intended primarily for acts by civilians.

n June, 2018 William Bostic and his son Joshua Bostic were driving in Upper Merion Township, when they witnessed a car hit a guardrail and go into a body of water. Bill and his son stopped, jumped into the water and swam to the car. At the same time, Kemp Littlepage, who had stopped, was also swimming to the car, which had started to sink. Mr. Littlepage was able to free the unconscious driver from the seatbelt but the door was jammed. While the car was sinking, the Bostics were able to get the passenger door open and while Josh held the door, Bill Bostic and Kemp Littlepage were able to get the driver out of the car and safely to shore where the paramedics had arrived. The driver, who had a seizure, was saved. PCC awarded William Bostic and Kemp Littlepage the SAR Heroism Award and Joshua Bostic received the SAR Life Saving Award.





PCC HISTORY 1985-1986

At the Annual Meeting of the Philadelphia Continental Chapter, Noon, November 4, 1985 at the Engineers' Club, President General Warren G Hayes (1983-84) installed President Elect Col William H Cowper as President and presented him with the Gavel of Authority. After a short acceptance speech, President Cowper awarded Past President Louis S Baker a Meritorious Service Medal. Also installed was Honorable Herbert K Zearfoss, First Vice President, Rev James M Murrey, Second Vice President and William G Dorwart, Secretary. The new budget for 1985-86 is \$6400. Interestingly, the chapter has a \$5000 CD @ 11.50%. Amazing.

The death of Compatriot Vice Admiral Ephraim McLean, Jr, USN Retired was reported at the regular meeting December 2, 1985 at age 82. Admiral McLean saw extensive combat action in the Pacific during WWII. His career began at the Naval Academy in 1920 and retiring in1959 after three years as Commandant Fourth Naval District, Philadelphia. He was awarded the Navy Cross (highest in US Navy) Remember the Bi-Centennial Host Fund---January 1986 balance--\$2430.

On February 22, 1986, the true Washington's birthday, the chapter held its annual George Washington Celebration and luncheon at the Engineers' Club. The entourage was hauled by busses to Independence Hall. After opening remarks by Vice President Zearfoss, the colors were presented, a flag raising ceremony was performed and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. A memorial wreath was placed at the Washington Statue by President General Warren G Hates and State President Earl W Traster. Rev Fleck offered the Commemorative prayer. A similar ceremony was held at the Unknown Soldiers Tomb in Washington Square after which the party was hauled back to the Engineers' Club for libation. The luncheon was opened with the presenting of the colors, the Guard being led by Col John F Mencer, Captain. Cost, \$17 per including bus service with 78 attendees, which was disappointing .

Nearly one hundred members and guests of PCC attended its annual Church Service Sunday April 13th at Valley Forge Military Academy in conjunction with the regular Cadet services. Following the service all moved to the parade ground to witness a full parade and review of the corps. SAR members and guests were then escorted to Eisenhower Hall for libation and luncheon. Allegiance Sunday was celebrated July 6th at Wayne Presbyterian Church with Rev Robert L Gordon officiating. In August 1986 the Bi-Centennial Host Fund had reached \$3280 with 118 members or 27% participation. The Constitution Week Celebration was held at Williamson Restaurant in Horsham on September 20, 1986. The guest speaker was Benjamin Franklin portrayed by Carl W Gatter. Cost, \$13 per with 183 attendees. The Newsletter Editor, Past President Harry Woolever has moved to Arizona and has resigned. Harold L Wood is the new Editor.

The Annual Meeting was held on November 3rd at the Engineers' Club with 41 members present. President Cowper gave a short resume of his term in office. President General (1983-84) Warren G Hayes installed President Elect Herbert K Zearfoss. Past President Cowper presented President Zearfoss with the President's Ribbon and the Gavel of Authority after which President Zearfoss gave a short acceptance speech. With no other business he then adjourned the meeting.
