Sculptor Pierre Lefebvre, Lanny Patten and Don Drewry



he Pennsylvania Society SAR commissioned and procured a work of art bronze bust by Sculptor Pierre Lefebvre of the Comte de Rochambeau, c.1781, and gifted it to the Fine Arts Department at Lafayette College in Easton, PA, The bust was delivered to the College on April 18, 2018 by the sculptor and SAR Compatriots Lanny Patten (past PCC President) and Don Drewry (Valley Forge Chapter). It was received by LC Curator Michiko Okaya, Artifacts Curator Diane Shaw and French faculty member Olga Anna Duhl. This College holds a major collection of fine art and artifacts from the life of the Marquis de Lafayette and French participation in the American Revolution. The bust is to become a major item in a new public exhibition at the College.

PCC History Review 1979-1980

The 78th Annual Dinner and Meeting was held Monday, November 12th, 1979 in the Philadelphia Room at the Engineers Club of Philadelphia. After reports from the various committees and dinner President Henry B Brown, Jr presented newly installed President Theodore Clattenburg with the gavel and neck insignia. Past Chapter and PASSAR President Warren G Hayes did the actual Installation of the Officers. Cost of this affair was \$8.50 per. Due to a misunderstanding the Grand Ballroom of the Benjamin Franklin Hotel will not be available for the Constitution Week Celebration on September 21, 1980. Instead, the celebration was held at the Holiday Inn, Downtown. The Color Guard paraded 12 flags with several volunteers helping out. The report states it was a most impressive sight and was signed by Col Paul K Brown, Captain of the Color Guard. Also, it states the Washington Birthday Celebration, February 23, 1980, both Independence Hall and the Unknown Monument at Washington Square were visited. Obviously under Col Brown the Guard has made a vast improvement.

For reasons unknown I cannot find additional material for year 1980—Perhaps it will show a bit later.

PCC History Review 1980-1981

t the 79th Annual Installation Dinner held in the Philadelphia Room of the Engineers Club Wednesday November 12, 1980, Warren G Hayes, Jr., Secretary General NSSAR, installed the officers. Past President Theodore Clattenburg presented the gavel and neck insignia to President Ammon L Hollinger. The total budget for 1981 is \$2750. Dues have been increased, National by \$2 to \$8, State by \$2 to \$7 and Chapter by 50 cents to \$8 making a total of \$23. According to the audit of fiscal year ended October 31, 1980 the total cash balance including checking account, savings account, General Fund and Memorial Fund is \$11,155. The budget for 1982 has increased to \$3700.

The Washington Birthday Celebration was held February 21, 1981 at the Engineers Club. As with past years, busses were chartered to haul folks down and back from Independence Hall for the wreath setting at the Washington Statue. A wreath was also placed at the Unknowns Tomb in Washington Square. President Hollinger spoke briefly at both locations. The two wreaths were left over from Christmas and cost the chapter zero. It was suggested this procedure be followed in the future. A reception and luncheon followed. The speaker for this occasion was Robert Trucksess, Esq, who earned himself a Silver Good Citizenship Medal for his effort. His talk was excellent and was entitled "A Tribute to the American Flag". Apparently the Color Guard is doing much better under the leadership of Col Paul K Brown. They paraded the colors at all three locations.

Sunday April 26, 1981, 32 persons including members of the Order of Founders and Patriots and wives attended the Annual Memorial Service at Arch Street Presbyterian Church. The Rev Dr G Hall Todd, Chaplain of the Chapter, conducted the service. Loyalty and Patriotism, the theme of the day, were beautifully expressed in the prayers, hymns and songs. Following the service the group moved to the nearby Sheraton Hotel for luncheon.

Sadly, at the September 14th meeting, President Hollinger reported the death of Compatriot C Leslie Hunsberger. His arduous keeping of chapter minutes, communications of all kinds typewritten and preserved in vinyl jackets then put in a three ring binder make the composition of this history project possible. He was a workhorse who was involved in chapter activities at all levels and was Chapter President in 1961-62. Nothing got by Les Hunsberger.

The 12th Annual DAR/SAR Constitution Week Celebration was September 19, 1981 at the Center City Holiday Inn. Guest speaker was Honorable Joseph C Bruno, Court of Common Pleas, City of Philadelphia. His oration earned him the Silver Good Citizenship Medal. Cost \$12 per plus \$2.50 parking. A report states some 300 members and guests attended this affair.

President Hollinger presented the Gavel and Insignia to newly elected president William G Dorwart after the installation by Warren G Hayes, Jr., Secretary General NSSAR. Henry B Brown, Jr., Genealogist PSSAR, presented the Past Presidents badge to Mr Hollinger.

Valley Forge NHP is part of the Schuylkill River National & State Heritage Area, which stretches 128 miles from Philadelphia to Pottsville. The region is nationally significant for the roles that its people, places, and events played in the American, industrial, and environmental revolutions

None of the original soldier huts remain. The huts that you see in the park today are reproductions based on the model that General Washington wanted the soldiers to follow. Despite a lack of tools and the relative haste in which they were built, most served as decent shelters for the troops.
